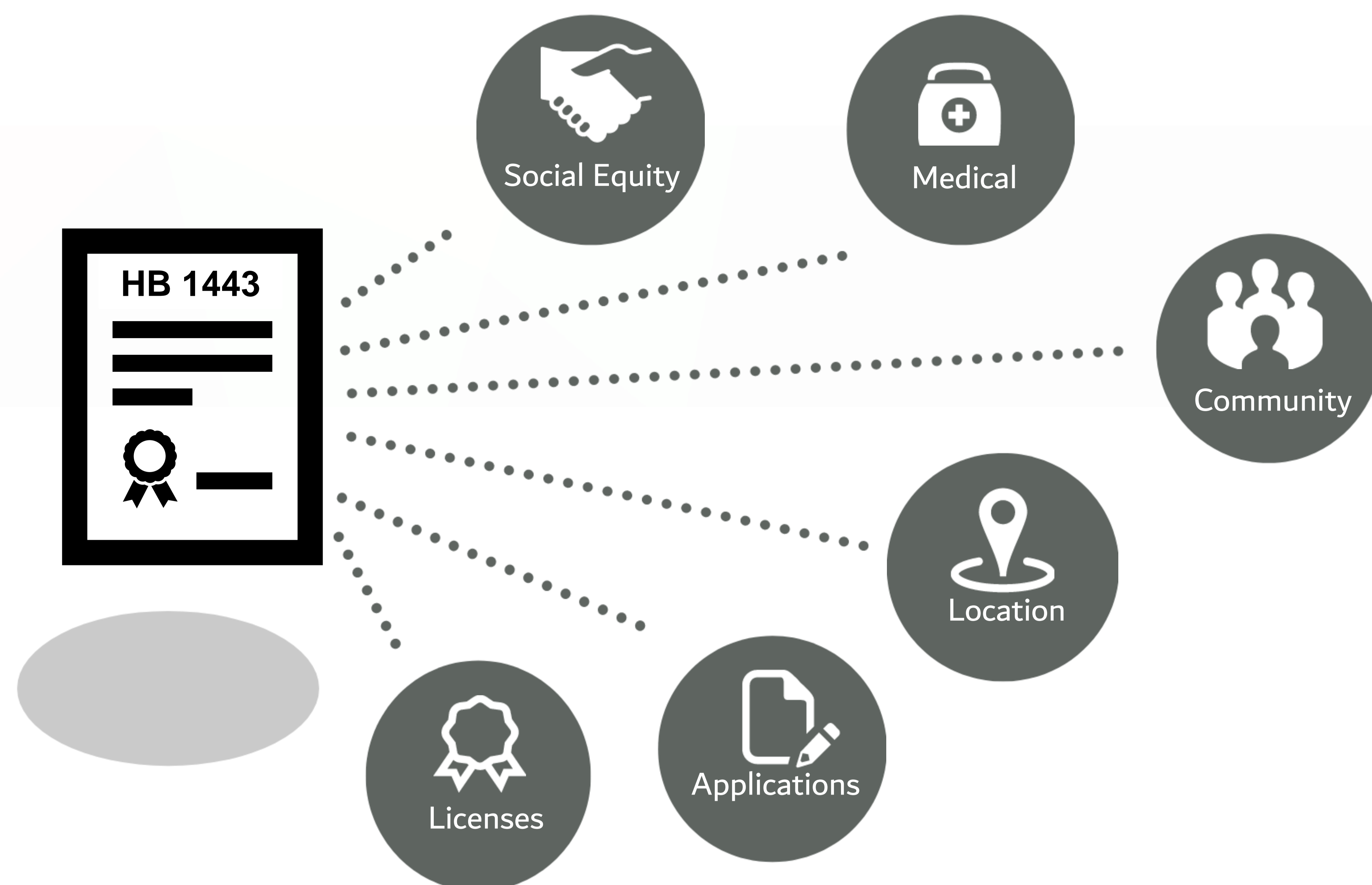


# HB 1443

## What Does HB 1443 Do?

House Bill 1443 builds upon the Cannabis Regulation Tax Act (CRTA) by establishing more comprehensive criteria to award 110 adult use cannabis dispensary licenses in 2021. This bill represents the cooperative work of community, applicants, industry, and regulators to help Illinois obtain the social equity goals set out in the CRTA.



## What is in HB 1443?
