DEFICIENCIES

FOUR ROUNDS OF DEFICIENCIES

Round One - Allowed applicants to correct missing or corrupt files.

Round Two - Allowed Social Equity Applicants to correct deficiencies in establishing their social equity status.

Round Three - Allowed applicants to address other remaining deficiencies.

Round Four - Allowed top-scoring applicants to provide information missing from exhibits that were not assigned points.

LICENSES

AWARDS

Once these top-scoring applicants pay the \$40,000 licensing fee and submit a certification form, they will receive their license. Applicants have 10 days to submit these required fees and documents or request an extension (Transporter applicants have until Feb. 14, 2022 to submit).

APPLICATIONS

MARCH 2020

The Department began accepting applications for Craft Grower, Infuser, and Transportation licenses.

NOTICE OF AWARDS

JULY 15, 2021

The Department sent Notices of Award to top-scoring Craft Grower, Infuser, and Transporter applicants.

NEXT STEPS

ADDITIONAL LICENSES

Pursuant to the CRTA, the Department will be issuing up to 60 additional craft grower and up to 60 additional infuser licenses by December 21, 2021.

Applicants who previously submitted applications for craft grower and infuser licenses that did not receive a Notice of Award may still be eligible to receive one of these additional licenses.
